



### EXPEDITE UKRAINIAN RE-PAROLE AND WORK PERMITS

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**Problem:** Many Ukrainians who applied for re-parole and work permit renewals several months ago now have expired status, exposing them to immigration detention and loss of jobs, licenses, insurance, and services.

**Solution:** Ask USCIS to expedite these applications and not penalize those who file before their 6-month expiration due to processing delays.



### REDESIGNATE UKRAINE'S TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS

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**Problem:** Ukraine's TPS designation expires October 19, 2026, and only Ukrainians who arrived by August 16, 2023 are eligible to apply for this protection. Yet, the war makes it very dangerous to return to Ukraine.

**Solution:** Ask DHS to extend and redesignate Ukraine's TPS so that all Ukrainians who came here on visas or parole can stay and work legally.



### REOPEN UNITING FOR UKRAINE TO NEW BENEFICIARIES

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**Problem:** Americans are eager to welcome more Ukrainians. But since U4U was suspended in January 2025, no sponsor applications have been accepted and no Ukrainian beneficiaries have been allowed to arrive.

**Solution:** Ask DHS to re-open this vital avenue to allow Ukrainians living in danger to come to the U.S. temporarily to live, work, and attend school.



### LET UKRAINIAN PAROLEES SEEK EMPLOYMENT VISAS

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**Problem:** Employers want skilled Ukrainian workers, but parolees can't get temporary or permanent employment-based visas from inside the United States. They must travel abroad to interview at a U.S. consulate – sometimes in war-torn Ukraine – and risk being denied back into the U.S.

**Solution:** Ask USCIS and the State Department to give paroled Ukrainians access to these visas without needing to leave the safety of the U.S.



### CREATE NEW LONG-TERM PATHWAYS FOR UKRAINIANS

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**Problem:** Most Ukrainians paroled into the U.S. don't have qualifying U.S. relatives or employment-based pathways to seek lawful permanent residence. Once their parole expires and the current TPS term ends, they will need to leave or face deportation. Many have nowhere to go.

**Solution:** Promote bipartisan support for the Ukrainian Adjustment Act that would allow Ukrainians to apply for green cards without sponsorship.
